# Robert Renfroe To Enter Army

#### Band Director Will Leave Here Jan. 15

Robert Renfroe, director of the Senior High Band, will lead the band in Interscholastic League competition Saturday for the last time. He will leave Jan. 15 for a career in the Army.

Renfroe received official notice of his new status this week. As yet, ,school officials have not appointed a successor, he said.

Renfroe came to Texas City in Sept., 1946 as director of the Junior High Band. During his time with the Junior band, Renfroe directed the group into many awards, including first place in a national contest held in Enid. Okla.

He became director of the Stingaree Band in 1949. Last year's band activities included participation in a Galveston parade, the La Marque Band Festival, the state fair and represention of New Mexico at the Rice-New Mexico football in Houston.

In addition to these activities, the band also won several first place honors in marching and concert contests.

Renfroe received his B. S. degree at Sam Houston State Teacher's College and is at present completing work on a master's degree.




This spring, the junior high school band passed up the state competition in order to raise funds for the tri-state festival.

The seventeenth annual meet will be held in Enid, Oklahoma, on May 12-14.


Tickets to the concerts are on sale at 35 cents for students and \$1 for adults.


